- Arbor Day work with your city to plant trees
- Participate in the Legislative process using the Legislative Action Center and writing and calling congress representatives to further GFWC causes
- Participate in Soles4Souls and used sneakers for donations to Nike's Reuse-A-Shoe program
- The Million Dollar Club 1,000 clubs or individuals donat1ng \$1,000 to the Capital Campaign for Head-quarters restoration.
