PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - SEPTEMBER 2019 CALL



It seems like summer only just arrived and already we are talking about fall. I hope you took advantage of the summer vacation and spent time with your family and friends and are returning to club work refreshed and with renewed enthusiasm.

Several items happened at the GFWC Convention in June that will affect our clubs.

The bylaw to change the titles of some of our Community Service Programs was adopted. The following name changes will take effect July 1, 2020.

Arts and Culture (formerly Art)

Civic Engagement and Outreach (formerly Public Issues)

Education and Libraries (formerly Education)

Environment (formerly Conservation)

Health and Wellness (formerly Home Life)

The category of International Outreach has been eliminated and those projects will be incorporated into all other categories.

Domestic Violence Awareness and Prevention and Advocates for Children remain the same.

Please remember these changes do not take place until July 1, 2020.

Three Brand Initiatives were introduced.

- 1. That 1,000 calls or emails will be made to United States Representatives on September 23, 2019 urging passage of Miranda's Law HR 2793.
- 2. That 1,000 calls or emails will be made to United States Senators and Representatives on October 23, 2019 urging passage of the 3D Printed Gun Safety Act of 2019.
 - 3. That 1,000 club/state projects will be in place to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of Women winning the right to vote, August 26, 2020.

You will be hearing more about the new initiatives and what clubs can do to participate in them at the Council meeting.

Our Dean Mary Sprague planned, coordinated and presented a wonderful Summer Conference. We had more than 100 participants, heard from CHOC Foundation about the work they are doing and how we can help plus we were able to attend informative workshops on a variety of subjects. What a great morning!

Our September 13th Council meeting will feature Bill Bracken, Founder/Culinary Director of Bracken's Kitchen. Bracken's Kitchen rescuses food to feed people, not send it as waste to the landfills but to repurpose quality, recovered food to make healthy meals. It also gives a path out of poverty for young adults through culinary workforce training and feed hungry children and adults with a dignified quality experience. I know you will not want to miss this presentation.
