CONSERVATION NOTES

Single-use Plastic Straws...In the U S we use over 500 million straws EVERY DAY. Most of these end up in the ocean. An estimated 71% of seabirds and 30% of turtles have been found with plastic in their stomachs which then leads to a 50% mortality rate. As with the plastic in cigarette butts, the plastic straws break down into smaller and smaller pieces (micro-plastics) instead of biodegrading or dissolving and then can be ingested by marine life. Even recycling has proven ineffective as the straws are too lightweight to be contained in the mechanical sorter and ends up as more garbage in the landfills.

YOU CAN HELP:

- 1. Support AB 1884 (Calderon), a measure that would require dine-in only restaurant servers to refrain from handing out plastic straws unless requested.
- 2. Get in the habit of saying "No thank you" to plastic straws when offered
