

The following information comes from a survey of Children's Doctors serving at these CHOC facilities. They are also parents of young children. They were asked to comment on "playdates" and their experiences with their own family. Playdates are beneficial in many ways especially social growth, but the doctors make suggestions on what to ask the host, before the event.

- * Is there a pool on the premises?

 If so, a designated adult should be assigned at all times for that area.
- *Is anyone in the home unwell? Do they have a fever? Don't go there.
- *Will the children be watching cable tv or movies?

 Inform the parents of the titles and subjects of this screen time.
- *Is there a trampoline at the location?

 All doctors said they would not allow their children to visit. All agreed, trampolines are deadly. They can result in broken bones and head injuries. Do not go there.
- *Are there pets in the home?
 Are they kid friendly? Are there allergy problems?
- *Are there guns in the home? Are they safely locked away?

GFWC needs our help. If you are not registered for Legislative Action Alerts, you may not know that they need us each to send a letter to our local Representative in Congress. Please share this letter text with your members so they can sign a letter and mail it.

Dear Representative xxxx,

The Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) has been incredibly successful in transforming our nation's response to domestic violence and sexual assault. Yet so much remains to be done to ensure that all survivors are fully supported and have options to keep themselves and their children safe.

As a member of the General Federation of Women's Clubs, an international women's organization dedicated to community improvement by enhancing the lives of other through volunteer service, I urge you to support H.R.1585, the Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2019.

This bill contains modest enhancements and critical fixes to existing law, invests in prevention, improves access to justice for Native survivors, protect victims of dating violence and stalking from abusers with guns, improves enforcement of court orders, and increases access to save housing for survivors.

I urge you and your colleagues to move swiftly in passing the Violence Against Women Act of 2019 without harmful amendments that would roll back vital existing protections for all victims and include enhancements that improve on services and supports for survivors.

Now is the time to invest in responding to and preventing domestic and sexual violence. We must reduce barriers and increase access for all survivors.

Be sure to have each member sign their letter, including their printed name and address, then mail it to their elected Congressional Representative.
